TOWNSHIP OF DELRAN RESOLUTION 2022-208

AUTHORIZING EXECUTIVE SESSION TO DISCUSS THE FOLLOWING: POTENTIAL LITIGATION

WHEREAS, N.J.S.A. 10-4.6 et seq. (Open Public Meeting Act) provides for the exclusion of the public from public meeting for certain reasons; and

WHEREAS, it is necessary to close the work session meeting of November 22, 2022 for the following reason:

Mr. Jeney made a motion to end the closed session and reopen the meeting to the public. The motion was seconded by Mr. Smith. All were in favor, motion approved.

Engineering Roadway Funding – Mr. Bellina reported that Earle Asphalt will be doing the work on Haines Mill Road in Spring of 2023. Mr. Bellina explained that previously there were discussions to jump start the design process for Stewart Avenue (NJ DOT grant program should help with the cost) and then Red Stone Ridge, Pine Valley Road, Drew Court, and Randle Court. The new process would begin the year before so the projects can be designed in the fall and winter and then bid shortly thereafter. This is advantageous because bidding in the winter months will yield more competitive pricing. Mr. Bellina also suggested that since sewer work also needs to be done, knowing that number would allow funds to be appropriated through the sewer capital also. Mr. Bellina asked to approve a bond ordinance during the month of December. The design costs for both projects is estimated at \$300,000 and Mr. Bellina has already communicated with the bond counsel and our auditor to discuss the plan.

Mr. Burrell stated that there would need to be a first reading of the ordinance at the next council meeting but a Zoom meeting would be required because there isn't enough time for notice between the first December meeting and the second. It was decided that a Zoom meeting will be held on December 6, 2022 at 5:00 PM.

<u>Harbor District</u> – Postponed until the next meeting

<u>Town wide Sewer Evaluation</u> – Ed D'Armiento reported that it is recommended that Delran begin a township wide sewer evaluation. The sewer department has the capabilities to use CCTV to capture the infrastructure of the 64 miles of gravity sewer in town and \$10,000 should be budgeted next year for this task. Mr. Bellina reported there would not be a problem with funding. Mr. Catrambone stated that CME did an evaluation approximately 12-14 years ago. Mr. D'Armiento stated that he can locate the evaluation for comparison.

Mr. Bellina will know how much that will mean for Delran Township in the next week or so. The cost of health insurance will also be going up.
