Sunshine Statement: Be advised that proper notice has been given by the Township Council in accordance with the sunshine law in the following manner. Notice advertised in the Burlington County Times and Camden Courier Post on January 6, 2023 and posted on the bulletin board on the same date.

VERMES SOCCER FIELD LIGHTING PROJECT

Mr. D'Armiento stated that a couple of conceptual plans have been provided to the DPW for the lighting project at Vermes Soccer Field. Mr. D'Armiento met with the superintendent of public works and a meeting will be scheduled with the Delran Recreation Advisory Committee to discuss the options. The grant for this project is \$84,000 and is only for the lights. Mr. Bellina explained that surveying will be done to make sure that no other work needs to be done in the park before the lights are installed. The project will also need to be reviewed by Green Acres prior to any work taking place. Mr. Bellina will report back with an estimate of what needs to be provided for bonding.

PSE&G – STATUS OF IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

PSE&G proposed that work in the vicinity of Hartford and Bridgeboro Roads be conducted at night rather than during the day. Working at night between 8:00 PM and 5:00 AM will expedite the work and will reduce the time of the project by one and a half months. Another plus will be a reduction in the amount of people affected by the back-ups caused by day work. PSE&G stated that saw cutting, which is very loud, will be done during the day. Mr. Bellina explained that it will be much safer if the work is done at night. He asked PSE&G if the residents in the area will be contacted. PSE&G reported that they will contact residents via door hangers, emails and phone calls. Weekends will not be included at this point. The work involves installing an underground conduit and manhole system associated with the new substation being built on Hartford Road. The whole project will increase reliability and alleviate the strain on existing substations. Work should begin at some point in September.

TOWNSHIP OF DELRAN BURLINGTON, NEW JERSEY

ORDINANCE 2023-13

ORDINANCE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF DELRAN, COUNTY OF BURLINGTON, STATE OF NEW JERSEY, SUPPLEMENTING CHAPTER 12 "TRAFFIC", SECTION 12-3.12A "PARKING OF COMMERCIAL AND RECREATIONAL VEHICLES" OF THE MUNICIPAL CODE OF THE TOWNSHIP OF DELRAN

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Township Council of the Township of Delran, in the County of Burlington and State of New Jersey, that:

SECTION 1. Chapter 12 Traffic, § 12-3.12A "Parking of commercial and recreational vehicles." of the Municipal Code of the Township of Delran, be amended by inserting the text <u>underlined</u> <u>and marked in bold</u> and deleting bolded text enclosed in brackets and crossed out to read as follows:

§12-3.12A Parking of commercial and recreational vehicles, use as permanent dwelling prohibited.

- a. No person shall park or allow to remain standing a truck, tractor, trailer, bus or any other type of vehicle registered with a gross weight greater than 9,000 pounds, having a commercial registration, on any residential street, commercial or industrial street under the jurisdiction of the Township of Delran, or portion thereof, between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.
- b. No person shall park or allow to remain standing any house trailer, mobile home, camper or recreational vehicle, boat or personal watercraft or other type trailer upon any street or public right-of-way within the Township of Delran between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.
- c. No person or persons belonging to the same household within the Township of Delran shall park or allow to remain standing more than one vehicle with a gross weight equal to or less than 9,000 pounds, having a commercial registration or utilized for any commercial purposes, on any residential street under the jurisdiction of the Township of Delran, or portion thereof, between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.
- d. No person shall park any trailer, camper, pole trailer or recreational vehicle in any street in the Township of Delran for a period longer than four hours and may not be parked upon any street or public right-of-way within the Township of Delran between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m. No automobile or vehicle of any type, including, but not limited to, any trailer, van, camper, or recreational vehicle, whether lawfully parked on a street or private property or kept in dead storage on private property, shall be used by any person as a dwelling or sleeping place.

SECTION 2. Each section of this Ordinance and every subsection hereof shall be deemed independent, separate and distinct from all other sections, and the holding of any section or a part hereof to be unconstitutional, void, or ineffective for any cause shall not be deemed to affect the

validity or constitutionality of any other section or part hereof, and to this end, the provisions of this Ordinance are hereby declared severable.

SECTION 3. All other ordinances, codes or parts thereof that are in conflict or inconsistent with this Ordinance are hereby repealed, to the extent of such conflict or inconsistency. In the event of any inconsistencies between the provisions of this Ordinance and any prior Township ordinances, the provisions hereof shall be determined to govern. All other parts, portions and provisions of the Township's ordinances are hereby ratified and confirmed, except where inconsistent with the terms hereof.

SECTION 4. This Ordinance shall take effect upon passage and publication as required by law.
